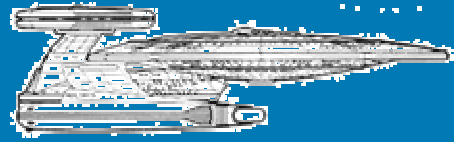

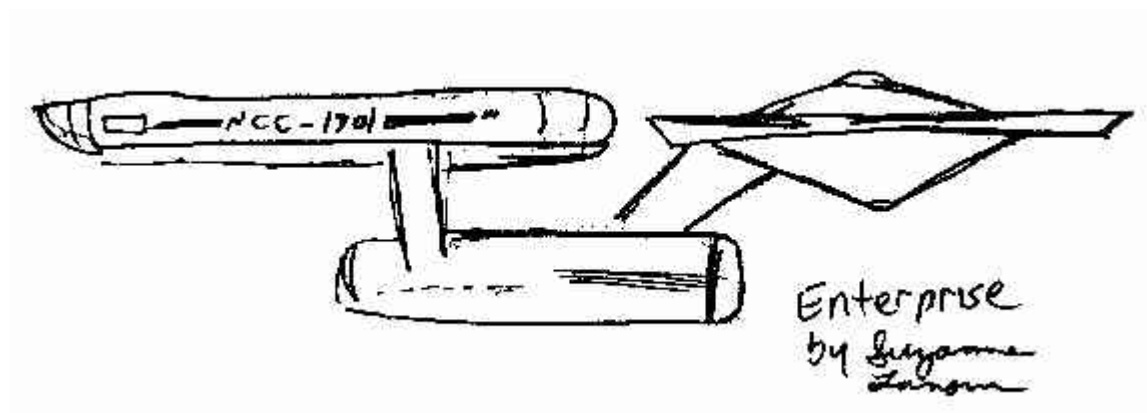

While we're having all this fun, we'll be able to read actual information, too, scrolling across the top of the screen -- trivia about casting, costs and other minutiae Trekkers have long proved themselves so fond of. The screen's bottom real-time chat room will pose questions ("What else could you use a Tribble for?) and show viewer answers ("cat Toy" or the edgier "to rub down UHU with"). Those who prefer their "Trek" unadulterated can watch the original episodes full screen in marathon form each Saturday (9 am to 4 pm). But most Trekkers should find cyberspace is the place to be.

FYI

In the ages before starships roamed space, the US Navy required that each of its ships pass a series of tests or drills in order to become certified for sea duty. A Starship, Space Station, or other Vessel should also pass inspection before it is put into service. Each department and ultimately the entire vessel can earn its certification.

This series of certifications is to be earned through the efforts of the entire Starfleet crew of a Starfleet Vessel (hereafter referred to as "Ship".)

The purpose of this program is to combine the efforts of Starfleet crews taking Academy classes (SFA or SFMCA). In the past, members took classes individually for their own edification, receiving promotion points for earning each diploma. (OTS and OCC were the only Academy courses that affected the entire Vessel.) The VRCP is designed to provide a platform in which Starfleet members can pool their diplomas for the good of the ship.

As of February 2, 2004 the McNair has been certified in the following Departments:

Command
Operations
Counselor
Science

We are not certified in Medical or Communications. This is not something that SFI requires that each Chapter has. We started doing it to get the crew together to get together for the good of the ship.

What the Section Rep Does

For those of you that are new to Starfleet International and the USS McNair. Starfleet is divided into Regions and the McNair is in Region One or First Fleet. We have a Sector Commander, Senior Captain and Section Rep for SC. Below is what the Section Rep does

REGION ONE'S SECTION REPRESENTATIVE PROGRAM

The job of the Section Representative is to help to facilitate ideas, which will aid the chapters and shuttles in their state to learn to work, play and communicate together. Examples would be: doing a section newsletter, or group e-mail using information from the ships in the section, helping plan joint ventures (picnics, parties, gaming nights, etc. - basically fun stuff) for 2 or more ships that are close enough to do these type of things, or post chapter meeting times to the Sector or Region. If possible plan a section "get-together" for all the ships in the section and perhaps even expand this to getting a couple of sections together for some fun activity, perhaps once a year or every other year. It would also be nice to see the Section Reps. have a meeting for the ships in their state at the Summit and/or Fall Conference each year. In other words the Section Reps. job is to help the ships/shuttles in their section learn to work together and bond to ultimately help create a stronger region, but mostly to help ships/shuttles know they are not out there alone, there are others going through the same things, having the same type of fun, struggling with the same problems, etc.

The Section Representative's responsibilities will be:

- 1) Keep close contact with chapters in your state on at least a monthly basis.
- 2) Serve as a welcome wagon to new chapters providing them with information on all the regional resources at their disposal.
- 3) Report and otherwise work closely with your Sector Commander, Senior Captain, Other Section Reps, or members of the Regional Staff.
- 4) Promote get togethers and other events with the chapters in your sector to foster chapter cooperation and interaction.
- 5) Monthly reports to the Sector Commander. [See rules for reporting under the Senior Captain]
- 6) When possible, have a meeting for their section at the Summit and/or Fall Away Mission each year.

What the Section Rep does continued...

Requirements for the Section Representative position:

- 1) Have passed both OTS and OCC.
- 2) Have a positive and outgoing personality and be able to coordinate multiple chapter events in your sector.
- 3) Be willing and able to travel to other chapter meetings in your sector and the RI Summits, if time and finances permit.

Challenger Center 10th Anniversary

The day was blustery and cold as the crew of the McNair made it's way across the asphalt towards the Challenger Learning Center. Outside was a sentient creature, planet of origin unknown. With our usual First Contact bravado the Captain, CMO and Nurse made their way to towards the creature. Imagination came from a quote he came across on the internet ascribed to Albert Einstein that said "Imagination is even more powerful then knowledge" and how he was debating this between them talking aloud. Without imagination space flight would never be realized. While on a plane from Washington, DC to Columbia, SC the word amazing came into play when he thought about how the plane with all the passengers luggage and being of a huge size could lift off the ground with just the pull of a lever and manage to stay in the air. Tuskegee Airman Lt Col Spann Watson (ret) spoke that in 1927 at the age of ten he knew he wanted to be a pilot after seeing Charles Lindbergh. He told the students to get all the education you can. Don't get left behind.

Carl McNair, brother of Ronald E. McNair, who was the eldest by ten months and in school while Carl was 8th in the class Ronald was 1st. He went on to speak about a quote ascribed to his brother. "Before you make your dream come true, you must first have one." He recognized the members of the McNair.

Grace Corrigan, Mother of Sharon Christa McAuliffe spoke about her daughter's love of being a school teacher and the opportunity to teach to the largest classroom in the world by being in outer space. Astronaut training for her was difficult, she was worried. Yet being given a shiny red apple alleviated her fears when she arrived in Houston. Christa said ordinary people make history and her Mother told the gathered students they are the future history makers.

Presentation of plaques and awards to the various guests and three children from the Challenger Learning Center.

Dr. Allen Coles, Richland County School District One spoke that the Challenger Learning Center is
