The USS Ronald E McNair is named after NASA astronaut Ronald E McNair

Ronald Ervin McNair the second African American to fly in space was born on October 20, 1950 in Lake City, South Carolina. After graduating from North Carolina A&T State College, he received his PhD in physics from MIT.

In 1984 he served as Mission Specialist on the space shuttle mission STS-41B.

On the morning of January 28, 1986 McNair and his six fellow crew members died tragically in the explosion of the space shuttle Challenger (STS-51L)
